Adverting to the references cited, I am to state
that the complaint made by Sri Yatagiri Chenchuramaiah
and other STs of Rajiv Gandhi Girijana colony, Nellore
was enquired into ^{and} the following are the facts elicited
during the enquiry.

On 2.4.2006 at 1930 hours, Sri Veguru Ravindra-
Reddy, s/o Ramana Reddy, Executive Officer, Ranganadha
Swamy temple, Ranganayakulapet, Nellore lodged a complaint
in No.IV Town(L & O) Police Station, Nellore. As per
it's contents there is a site measuring about 5.08 acres
in S.No.1576/328 and 1576/329 situated behind TTP office,
mini bye-pass road, Nellore which belongs to Sri Talpagiri
Ranganadha Swamy temple. The said land is in possession
of the temple. On learning that some of the eastern side
residents are trying to occupy the said temple land, he
visited the site and noticed that some have erected huts.
He asked them not to encroach up on the temple site.

They replied him that the land belongs to them and they have pattas. The E.O., asked them to show their pattas, but they refused to do so. When, the E.O., tried to remove the structures of the illegal huts, one Sri Devarajulu, Ex-Councilor, Nellore municipality and some others formed themselves into an unlawful assembly and assaulted him, with the common intention of preventing him from discharging his duties.

The above complaint of the E.O., was registered as a case in Cr.No.62/2006 u/s 143, 447, 353 r/w 149 IPC of No.IV Town Police Station, Nellore and investigated into.

During the course of investigation, it is revealed that it is true that the Mandal Revenue Officer had issued dwelling site certificates to some of the people in the year 2004 in S.No. 1341. But the accused Patra Subramanyam and some others with the instigation of Sulluru Devarajulu, Ex-Councilor have erected about 20 huts illegally in S.No. 1576/328 and 1576/329 which belongs to Sri Ranganadha Swamy Temple, Nellore.

It is also established in the investigation that the accused Patra Subramanyam, S.Devarajulu and 11 others assaulted the E.O., Thus, Prima facie a case was made out against the accused under the above sections of law.

I am further to state that on the representation of the E.O., the Mandal Revenue Officer, Nellore got measured the disputed site and asked the No.IV Town Police Station to provide protection for removal of the encroachments in S.No. 1576/328 and 1576/329. Accordingly, Police Protection was provided and the Revenue Authorities


have removed the illegally erected huts from the temple land. As such, the allegation levelled by the petitioners that the Police destroyed their huts, is not correct but motivated.

The entire issue pertains to the Endowments and Revenue Departments and the Police provided protection, only on the request of the Mandal Revenue Officer.

There are the facts in the matter and the allegations levelled in the complaint against the Police are motivated and far from the truth.

In view of the above facts, it is requested that the reference may please be ordered to be lodged.
