2. After welcoming the participants and their introduction, it was noted that the petitioner was not present. Hon'ble member decided to hear the officers of SECL.
3. The petitioner Smt. Pushpa Singh has submitted grievances of denial of appointment to her son Shri Vijay Pratap Singh in lieu of land acquired by the SECL. The petitioner alleged that her land Sy. No. 726/8 measuring 80 dismil at village Ramnagar, Tehsil – Kotma, Distt.- Anuppur (MP) was acquired by SECL, Hansdev Area in the year 2000. At the time of acquisition of land, the SECL management has promised to provide compensation and employment. However, the compensation of the land had been provided, but no employment was given to her son despite proposal approved by the SECL area officers. In addition, her son's medical has been made. But, no employment had been provided her son by the SECL.
4. The CMD, SECL stated that the compensation to the petitioner has already been paid. However, the employment to her son could not be given as she could not prove her ownership of that land for 20 years, a precondition for giving the employment under that scheme. The petitioner was awarded the lease of that land in 1984 which was less than 20 years.
5. **Since the petitioner was absent, the Commission decided to hold another hearing to decide the matter.**
